23	Congregations added and reporting for 2014 were Grace Parish, North Myrtle Beach and Resurrection, North Charleston. Grace, Waccamaw is combined with Christ the King, Waccamaw.														
24	St. James, Blackville was formally received as a mission in 2015, thus has not reported yet. Total 2015 congregations is therefore 52.														
25															
26	Drop in Baptized members for 2014 can be entirely attributed to one congregation "cleaning up its rolls" by 344 members and does not reflect membership leaving all in one year.														
27															
28	31 congregations were able to provide an age breakdown of baptized members. Of those that responded, the membership ages 0-10 was 11%, ages 11-18 was 10%,														
29	ages 19-30 was 10%, and over 30 was 69%, virtually unchanged from last year.														
30															
31	The age breakdown for baptisms for 2014 was 0-10, 82%; 11-18, 7%; 19-30, 3%; and ages 30 and over, 8%.														
32															
33	The age breakdown for confirmations for 2014 was 11-18, 42%; 19-30, 11%, and ages 30 and over, 47%.
