Grandparenting Ministry
August 28, 2025

GrandCamp 2025 was held June 16 – 20 at Epworth by the Sea on St. Simon’s Island, Georgia. It was the 12th annual gathering in our Diocese of grandparents with their grandchildren. This year we had 76 total participants (29 families). There were 35 grandparents, 32 grandchildren, 4 junior staff and 5 adult staff without grandchildren. We enjoyed intergenerational devotions every morning, led by Sherry Schumann. Workshops for the grandparents were led by John and Patti Sosnowski and Peter Rothermel. During the workshops, the children participated in a rotating system of small groups in Bible Study, Bible focused crafts/activities and outdoor games. There was an emphasis this year on all participants learning to navigate their way through the Bible. A big competition was held at the end of the week to see who could find certain Biblical passages the quickest. The grandkids beat the grandparents! The week culminated with a powerful Blessing Ceremony.

Plans for GrandCamp 2026 have begun. The dates of June 15 – 19 at Epworth by the Sea have been reserved with a \$5000 deposit. Registration online at our Diocesan website begins December 1st. NOTE: Camp is often fully booked by early March! So, get your registrations in early.

The Very Reverend Karl Burns summed up his first time GrandCamp experience: “Over the years, I’ve spent many summers at camps and retreats, but this one? This one topped them all. We laughed, played, prayed, and made memories that will last far beyond our time at Epworth by the Sea on St. Simons Island, Georgia.
