Standing Committee: two clergy needed to serve a three-year term

The Very Rev. Karl Burns Church of Our Saviour, Johns Island

The Very Rev. Karl Burns began his ministry in the Diocese nearly 30 years ago as a youth minister at All Saints', Florence.



Following his ordination, he served as an assistant at Old St. Andrew's and the Church of the Good Shepherd, and as middle school chaplain at Porter-Gaud School. He later returned to All Saints' as rector for five years before being called to serve as rector of the

Church of Our Saviour on Johns Island, where he has served for the past nine years. Throughout his ministry, Fr. Karl has offered leadership across the Diocese, serving on the Camp St. Christopher Advisory Board, Diocesan Council, and the Standing Committee—where he served as president in 2019—and representing the Diocese twice at Provincial Council. He currently serves as Chair of the Commission on Ministry and Dean of the West Charleston Deanery. Fr. The Rev. Luke Deman. St. Timothy's, Summerville

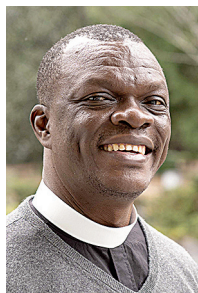
Diocesan Council: Two clergy needed to serve a three-year term

The Rev. Dave Fisher The Church of the Cross, Bluffton

Diocesan Council: Two lay persons needed to serve a three-year term

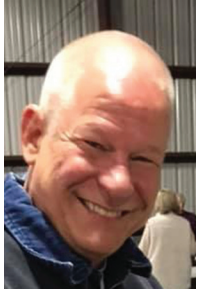
Sallie Brach The Church of the Cross, Bluffton
